

PLAYING WITH GUN HAROLD BRACE SHOOTS COUSIN

Little Victim Is Carl Brace,
Aged 8.

NOW AT THE CITY HOSPITAL

BULLET ENTERED CHEST—X-RAY
DOES NOT LOCATE BALL.

While playing with a revolver, ignorant of the fact that it was loaded, Harold Brace, aged 13 years, accidentally shot Carl Brace, aged 8, son of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Brace of Oregon street. The accident happened at the home of Martin Brace, an uncle of the injured boy and father of the youth who did the shooting.

The boys found the revolver in the drawer of a sewing machine and were not aware of the fact that the chambers of the weapon, which was a 38 calibre, was loaded with bullets.

The two boys were alone in the house at the time, their fathers being engaged in carpenter work in the rear yard. When the report was heard the men rushed into the house and found the injured boy on the floor. His father immediately picked him up and hurried to the office of Dr. Dodson.

The latter was not in his office so the boy was taken to his home, to which place Drs. Gibby and Myers were summoned and probed for the bullet without success. It was found that the ball entered the right side of the chest and passed between the lungs and lodged near the spine.

The injured youth was later removed to the City Hospital.

The doctors used the X-ray to-day, but were unable to discover the location of the bullet.
