

THE DEATH ROLL.

Charles Brace, an employe of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, died at his home at Hunlock's Creek yesterday, of gastritis. He had been ill about two months, but his condition was not considered critical until toward the last. He was 38 years of age and is survived by his wife and infant daughter, and by a brother, George Brace.

Martin Boyle, of 29 Coal street, Miner's Mills, died yesterday of hemorrhages, aged 32 years. He was a member of St. Dominic's parish, Parsons, and had a large circle of friends. He was a son of Patrick O'Boyle by whom he is survived.
